Important: Section 196.011(9a), Florida Statute provides if any property owner fails to notify the Property Appraiser and the Property Appraiser determines that for any year within the prior 10 years the owner was not entitled to receive such exemption, the owner of the property is subject to the taxes exempted as a result of such failure, plus 15% interest per annum and a penalty of 50% of the taxes exempted. It is the duty of the Property Appraiser making such determinations to record in the public records of the county, a notice of tax lien against any property owned by that person.
